Big Truth

God's people submit themselves for the Lord's sake.

Big Idea:

Jesus followers submit to earthly masters with all respect.

(22) Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord. (23) Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men,
Colossians 3:22-23

Masters, treat your bondservants justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

Big Idea: Jesus followers demonstrate grace by enduring well when suffering unjustly.

(11) "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. (12) Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Big Idea:
Jesus followers walk in the pattern of Christ by enduring well when suffering unjustly.

(22) He committed no sin, neither was deceit found in his mouth. (23) When he was reviled, he did not revile in return; when he suffered, he did not threaten, but continued entrusting himself to him who judges justly.
1 Peter 2:21-23
